Understand the process and requirements to demonstrate you can practice independently as a competent cost engineer.

If you have at about 20 years post graduate engineering experience, including 5 years in recognised Cost Engineering positions, you may be eligible for EA's 'Chartered in Cost Engineering via Interview' process for senior engineering professionals.
